SECTIONAL MAP OF HANCOCK COUNTY ILLINOIS

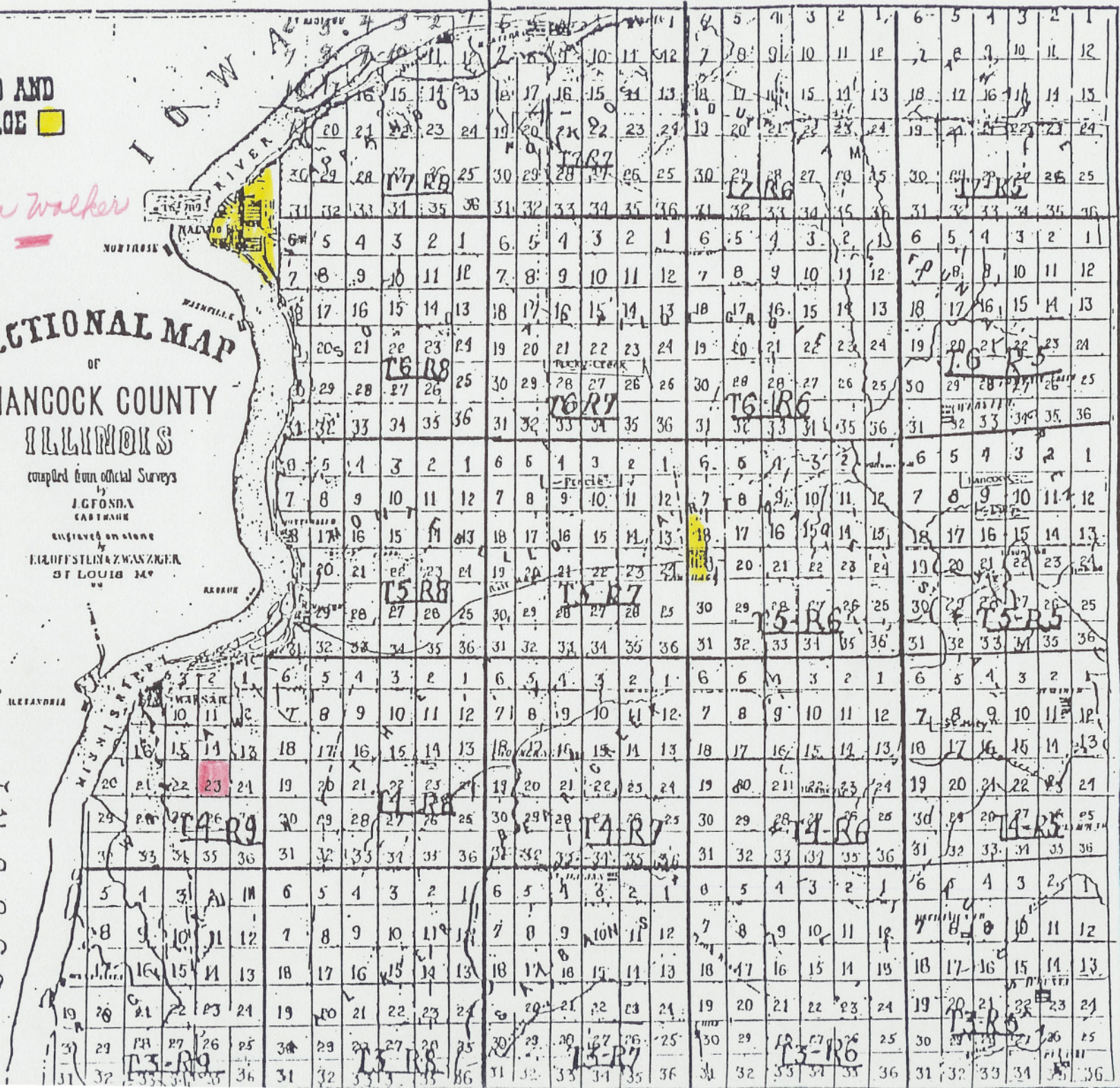

Nauvoo. During their marriage, he served a mission to Great Britian and served in the Black Hawk War. Diontha did not have any children with Amasa, but was much help with the wives that did. Amasa was excommunicated from the Church after rising to be one of the 12 Apostles. He passed away in 1877 in Fillmore, Utah. Diontha was a widow for nineteen years, passing away at age seventy eight in Minersville and is buried there.

Diontha was born in Ohio.1816. She was number eight of ten children. Her family were early, active members of the LDS church. After the death of her father her mother Nancy married Brigham Young. At nearly fourteen, she married Micah Whitney. They became parents of four children. Diontha lost her husband and all her children in a serious epidemic. Returning to her family, she endured the persecutions in Winter Quarters. Crossing the plains she helped care for the young daughters of her deceased sister Nancy, whose husband, Horace Alexander was in the Mormon Battalion. She was a favorite of the children of her youngest sister, Eveline Walker Rollins. They called her "Aunt Dee."

While still in Nauvoo, she became one of the nine wives of Amasa Mason Lyman and many of the Walker family came to Utah in his company. This was an Independent Company arriving in Salt Lake City 17 Oct 1848. Diontha, together with others of the wives, first made their home in Salt Lake City. Amasa was called, together with Charles C. Rich to settle in San Bernardino, California. After this time Diontha's home became Minersville, Utah. Here she was first counselor to President Mary Elizabeth Rollins Lighter, when the Minersville Ward Relief Society was initially organized 5 Apr 1869. Diontha was age 27 when she married Amasa in
